SPOKEN REFRAIN: Do not forsake me, O God of my salvation.

¹ The LORD is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear?
The LORD is the stronghold of my life; of whom shall I be afraid?

² When evildoers assail me to devour my flesh—my adversaries and foes—they shall
stumble and fall. ³ Though an army encamp against me, my heart shall not fear;


An invitation to the Leadership Team meeting!
