Fire From Heaven

On the day of Pentecost, suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came and tongues of fire rested on each of them and all were filled with the Holy Spirit.

—ACTS 2:1-4

The cycle that we began on Palm Sunday, Holy Week and Easter is drawn to completion this month on May 15th as we celebrate Pentecost together. That strange and sovereign journey that Jesus began by entering into Jerusalem on a Messiah's donkey, allowing himself to be executed as a criminal of the state, and then rising in forgiveness and love, now comes to a remarkable climax.

Christ does not complete his journey by exalting himself upon the throne of God to rule over the world but instead he empties himself. He sends his Spirit, the very essence of Himself, out into

the world to inspire and encourage and embolden his disciples to be, themselves, love-conduits in service to a hurting and confused world.

Pentecost is known fondly as the Birthday of the Church because the central effect that Jesus' Holy Spirit had upon all those who received it was unification. The Holy Spirit drew people together into community, originally called "ekklesia" in Greek, which we eventually translated as "church" in English. Forevermore the Christian spiritual journey would necessarily be a corporate one and even in the face of rugged western individualism, the church remains a great bastion of the communal life.

We will celebrate this in worship on Pentecost Sunday, May 15th with a festive Time for the Young, a fiery spirit-filled sermon from Rev. Judy and by welcoming a clutch of wonderful new members into our community. We hope you can join us as together we complete the Easter cycle and enter into a new season in the life of the church!

Can You Fill This Space? Devoted *Spire* readers may remember that last fall we had to remove a badly damaged dogwood tree from the base of the church's front walk. At its April meeting the Facilities Ministry decided that Spring has finally arrived and we can make plans

to replace this tree. To do that we need to find a generous parishioner (or more than one). The cost will be a function of the tree specie chosen and could range between \$1,500 and \$2,500. The donor can help us decide what is the best replacement—our arborist suggested some alternatives to the Kousa Dogwood that was there which may improve the tree's success in this spot. If you can do this for the church there are a lot of us tree huggers that would be eager to share hugs with you (after we hug the new tree first, of course).

SEASONS OF THE SPIRIT

Begin Afresh

May 15 is Pentecost Sunday, the day on which we celebrate the coming of the Spirit upon each person gathered in Jerusalem long ago. This Spirit offers itself in various iterations of language, heritage, ethnicity, and variety of experience, age, and gender. The gift and challenge of this reality is hard for us to fathom. The idea that the Spirit lives within each of us, and that we each have the power of the Spirit's indwelling is an awesome responsibility, especially since we also have the ability to respond positively to the Holy Spirit, or to close ourselves off to its invitations.

A poem I love to remember at this time of year is "The Trees" by Philip Larkin:

The trees are coming into leaf Like something almost being said. Their recent buds relax and spread. Their greenness is a kind of grief. Is it that they are born again, And we grow old? No, they die too, Their yearly trick of looking new Is written down in rings of grain. Yet still the unresting castles thresh, In full-grown thickness, every May. "Last year is dead," they seem to say, "Begin afresh, ...afresh, ...afresh."

We are called to allow the old foundations of our life, our families, and our church to blossom into new possibilities. Remember the story of two caterpillars edging out to the end of a tree branch? Suddenly they see a butterfly flying across the top of them. One turns to the other and says, "You'll never get me up in one of those!"

Often God's plans find us moving into new places that we could have never expected, with which we may find it difficult to cooperate. But if we can welcome new life and



change that is inevitable, we are welcoming the very presence and action of the Holy Spirit in our selves and in our midst. What a glorious possibility is offered!

What if that which is most authentic is not only ancient but also newborn, the living, that of today, the cusp we are only beginning to see? Rebecca Parker writes in "The Greening of God" (*The Center Post: A Journal of Rowe Center,* Spring/Summer 2016) "revelation comes to those who are radically hospitable to what they do not know. The choice to take the next step is an act of holy curiosity... To those who move in the midst of mystery and silence, even when trembling and afraid, the face of God sometimes appears. New ways of speaking of God arise from the luminous dark."

May God help us to welcome the new life growing out of certain endings, which we may find difficult to bear. May the promises of God sustain us as we walk together into the future that God has prepared for us, grounded in hope, faith, and love.
